losing players mark a round in post section. Finals day scheduled for all over 60's events 7 April 2027)

Entry open to any women who have won a club or Centre title. Teams must be from the same club.

This tournament does NOT qualify for Centre Gold Star.

Entries are submitted on a club basis for the Gibbons Trophy. Clubs are invited to submit single or multiple entries.

Kiwi Trophies and Engraving Development 2-4-2 Pairs (23 – 25 January 2027)

Any Year 1-10 bowlers may enter. This will be an “Open Gender” event. The event is open to teams of any mix of players. 2 men, 2 women, Mixed, or players of non-binary. This is traditionally known as “Any Combo”.

This tournament does NOT qualify for Centre Gold Star.

Format: The tournament will be run “open gender” which means any combo is permitted. Sections of four with winners of 2 or 3 games qualifying for post section. 3 games per day.

Wellington Over 60 Pairs (17 & 18 March 2027, with finals day 7 April 2027)

Open Gender. This will be an “Open Gender” event. The event is open to teams of any mix of players. 2 men, 2 women, Mixed, or players of non-binary age 60 years or over as at the first day of the tournament, 17 March 2027. This is traditionally known as “Any Combo”.

Bambery & Lynch Trophy Wednesday 31 March 2027

Hutt Valley and Wellington teams are selected from Men's and Women's Pennants players nominated by their clubs to represent their zone in a Hutt Valley vs Wellington match. In making a nomination, the player must confirm availability to play on the scheduled date.

Nominations close: TBC

2025 - 2026 Winners: Bambery (Hutt Valley) and Lynch (Wellington).

Format: Each zone (and gender) has 4 fours teams. Each team plays two games scoring 2 points for a win, one for a draw and 0 points for a loss. Scores are combined to give an overall men and women's winner, with shot differential and then ends won used in the event the points are even.

The Centre award a Bambery Pin (men) and Lynch Button (women) to each bowler participating in the tournament for the first time.

Champion of Champions

Each club championship winner (Junior 1-5 Singles, Singles, Pairs, Triples, Fours and Mixed 2-4-2 Pairs) is invited to enter the Bowls Wellington Champion of Champion series. These knockout tournaments are each played over 2 days with 3 rounds played on Day 1 (potentially 4 rounds for singles) and the remaining rounds (semifinal and/or final) being played on the Champion of Champions Finals Weekend scheduled for **15 & 16 May 2027** at Naenae. The Singles, Pairs, Triples, Fours & Mixed 2-4-2 Pairs are all Centre Title and Gold Star events. The winner of these events will be invited to represent Bowls Wellington at the Bowls New Zealand Pathways event.

Entry fee: \$30 per player (with no fee for Junior 1-5 years Singles entry) (The entry fee funding will be applied to help support Champion of Champions winners towards costs associated with the Bowls New Zealand pathways competition)

Tournaments – General Conditions of Play for Open Events

1. Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations to apply.
2. All players must conform to the General Conditions of Play as detailed within this section and any further conditions set out in the programme for specific events.
3. **Composition of Teams.**

All team members must be 'Full Playing Members' of the same club as per Bowls Wellington and Bowls NZ constitution. Limited Playing Members, Associate Members and Social Members are not eligible to play in Bowls Wellington competitions unless stated.

Composite family teams are permitted which include father/son, mother/daughter, sister/sister, brother/brother or grandparent/grandchild and may come from different clubs (providing they are all Full Playing Members).

Composite teams are permitted for the Mixed Pairs, husband/wife or partners for Open Gender and Over 60's Fours events. **This season Bowls Wellington will allow composite teams for Open and Other events (not Champ of Champ), to those clubs who have a small membership (under 5 members of one sex). These clubs can request to put in a composite side with Bowls Wellington using its discretion to accept or decline on a case-by-case situation.**

4. Game Formats (Unless otherwise specified)

Singles	4 bowls 21 shots or time limit 2 hours 15 minutes
Pairs	3 bowls 18 ends or time limit 2 hours 45 minutes
Triples	2 bowls 18 ends or time limit 2 hours 45 minutes
Fours	2 bowls 18 ends or time limit 2 hours 45 minutes
Pairs 2-4-2	4 bowls 14 ends or time limit 2 hours 45 minutes

Sections are generally played on one day, over 3 rounds. Those that win 2 or 3 games qualify for post section. Time Limits do not apply from the quarterfinal stages of Bowls Wellington tournaments.

The exception to the qualifying day format is the Open Singles & Over 60's singles tournaments. In the Open Singles where, whilst 2 or 3 wins is required to qualify, there will be 4 rounds of play. This tournament will comprise sections of 8 players. Whilst each will play 3 rounds there is the added requirement that each player must also mark a round. Failure to mark a round, as scheduled in the tournament draw, will result in a sanction. Play will commence at 8.30am to accommodate the 4 rounds of play. For the Over 60's singles sections will be made up of 3 players, with the section winner qualifying for post section. Each player is required to mark one round.



A default will be awarded against any player or team, not present on the rink of play 10 minutes after the scheduled start time unless there are exceptional circumstances determined by the controlling body.

5. Entries

No refund will be issued for any withdrawals after the entry deadline closes.

No free entry for 1-3 year players for 2026-27

6. Teams as listed in the draw

There may be a reason that the players registered to a team are different from those that take the green on the first day. This is permitted providing that Bowls Wellington Tournament Manager and the umpire at the green is informed. The umpire at another green is responsible for informing the Tournament Manager on the day.

7. Substitutes

A substitute may be permitted into a team at any stage during a game throughout the course of a tournament.

Substitute players may not play in the position of skip. The controlling body will consider applications for a substitute on the basis that, where possible, the substitute must be of equal or lesser playing ability.

There can only be one substitute for a pairs or triples team, and no more than 2 for a fours team. A singles player cannot be substituted (except in a side where another member of the side can substitute for the singles player).

An application for a substitute team member must be made in writing on the appropriate form and be presented to Bowls Wellington, or the Tournament Manager, prior to them playing. Under exceptional circumstances a verbal application may be accepted at the discretion of the Tournament Manager. The Controlling Body will decide on the eligibility and approve the use of a substitute. Application forms are available from the Bowls Wellington website, under "About" and "Key Documents".

8. Variation of Programme

The Tournament Manager retains the right to alter or amend the programme, including playing format, as deemed necessary. This includes, but not limited to, reasons of weather, green availability, participant numbers, schedule clashes and other unforeseen circumstances.

9. Decals – refer Law 52.1.8



Representative decals must not be used on bowls other than during Representative Tournaments. Players in breach of this will be asked to remove them.

10. Trial ends – Law 5.1

Trial ends may be played prior to the 1st game of the day, or otherwise as deemed appropriate by the controlling body, provided that the green is available. Trial ends must be completed before the scheduled start time unless the Tournament Manager advises otherwise. The Tournament Manager can limit the number of bowls played in the trial ends as needed to assure timely play for the day. Should a team, due to having a bye or otherwise, be unable to have trial ends before the first game of the day, they will be permitted to have a trial end before their first game. Their opponent may have trial ends with them.

11. Footwear and Clothing

All players must conform to Regulation 11 of Bowls NZ Domestic Regulations.

Wellington Tournaments

For any event other than the Mixed Pairs, members of Teams or Sides *must* wear garments of the same colour/design. Any garment may have logos displayed, but the Controlling Body may impose conditions relating to sponsor's logos to ensure that there is no conflict with a Tournament sponsor. Hoodies are permitted.

Representative clothing must not be worn at events other than Representative Events. This includes shirts, jackets, hoodies, trousers and headwear.

12. Time Limit Games

Unless otherwise stated, all Bowls Wellington tournament matches are played under a time limit. From the Semi-Final stages, Wellington Open tournaments, Champion of Champions, Prestige Pairs, Development Pairs and the Over 60's events, the time limit is removed.

Slow Play: Players must play without undue delay and in a way which does not prevent their opponents from being able to complete the required number of ends within the time limit decided by the Controlling Body.

We expect all players to abide by the spirit of the game at all times.

Replaying Dead Ends

If before the time signal sounds, the Jack has been delivered and subsequently made dead, the end shall be replayed until the end is completed.

Time Signal

The commencement of play and the expiry of time shall be signalled by the Umpire by a bell or some other means clearly audible to all players concerned.

Where the time limit is not common to all games on any green the start and finish time must be written on the score board and score card. Note: the players are responsible for managing their game time.



There will be no time limits in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Centre events

Drawn Game

Unless otherwise stipulated an extra end will be played if the game is drawn.

Restricting the Movement of Players During a Game

In all games, the movement of players shall be restricted as follows:

After delivering the first bowl, players will only be allowed to walk up to the head under the following circumstances:

| Singles: | The opponents after delivery of their third and fourth bowls |
| Pairs: | The Leads after delivery of their 3 rd bowl and the Skips after delivery of their 2 nd & 3 rd bowls. |
| Triples: | The Leads after they have delivered their 2 nd bowl, the Two after delivery of their 2 nd bowl and the Skips after delivery of each of their bowls |
| Fours: | The Leads after the second player in their team has delivered their second bowl, the Twos after delivery of their 2 nd bowl, the Thirds after delivery of their 2 nd bowl and the Skips after delivery of each of their bowls. |
| 2-4-2 Pairs: | The first player after the delivery of their 2 nd bowl, the player playing 4 bowls after the delivery of their 3 rd & 4 th bowl and the player playing the last 2 bowls after each of their bowls. |

In exceptional and limited circumstances, a skip can ask that a player walks up to the head earlier than described above.

If a player does not meet the terms of this condition of play, Law 13 of the Laws of the Sport of Bowls shall apply.

13. Synthetic Greens

These are approved for use in Centre events providing they have received endorsement from the Bowls Wellington Greenkeepers Association.

14. Cancellation of Play, Start Time Delay or Change of Venue

If a day's play is to be cancelled or altered before the scheduled start time a notice will be placed on the Bowls Wellington website and/or Facebook as early as possible. The decision on whether a green is open for play rests with the Green Keeper/Club officials. The impact of green availability and impact on the tournament then becomes a matter for determination by the Tournament Manager. Host clubs are expected to communicate with visiting Interclub, Pennants, Bowls3Five teams at the earliest convenience or in the case of tournaments, directly with the Tournament Manager. Players, who due to weather, play only one game, and do not qualify for further play in the tournament, are entitled to a 50% refund of their entry fee. Refund requests must be made by email to info@bowlswellington.com including bank account



details, within 48 hours. If a player withdraws after the tournament entry is closed, no refund will be provided.

15. Redraws

In the event of a tournament postponement, Section or Post Section may need to be redrawn should withdrawals 'significantly' impact the initial draw. Upon confirmation of the resumption date, withdrawals must be notified as soon as possible. Where possible, and providing sufficient time, a redraw will be made 10 days prior to the recommencement of the tournament. Any withdrawals after the redraw is published will not result in another redraw and the match will be considered a default.

16. Uncompleted Games

All sections run independently of each other, meaning progress and completion across venues may differ in the event of poor weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

- a) Should a section fail to be fully completed by the end of the first day, the following Post Section qualifying criteria apply;

If a team completes 2 games – those that have won 1 or 2 games qualify

If a team completes only one game – those who won the game qualify

If a team does not complete any games - all those teams qualify.

If all games in the tournament fail to be completed on the first day, the tournament will start from the 2nd scheduled day. The Tournament Manager has the right to play the event as a straight knock out event to complete the tournament play on the scheduled 3rd day.

- b) The Tournament Manager, in consultation with the umpire, is responsible for any decisions regarding calling off play. Closing of a green is the decision of the host greenkeeper/club.

17. Radios and Cell phones

Cell phones to be used on greens for those using the training and performance apps are permitted. Phone must be on silent. This is the sole reason use of a cell phone is permitted for use. Radios are not permitted on the green at any time, including but not limited to players, markers and officials.

Players and spectators are asked to be considerate of others when using radios or cellphones around the bank area in earshot of players on the green.

18. Use of Electronic Devices

Pursuant to Law 41.7, players with a hearing disability can use electronic devices to communicate with each other while on the rink of play, or with a marker in a singles game.

Electronic devices should not interrupt or interfere with any other players or disrupt the flow of the game. The electronic device must be non-intrusive to other players or officials that are present on the green at any time during a game. As a guide, the use of the device should be no more intrusive (in terms of volume) than any other conversation between players in any game.

19. Media and Communications



Bowls Wellington reserve the right to use any video and images taken during any Bowls Wellington administered events.

20. Alcohol Policy

Alcohol is not permitted on the green or surrounds at any time.

21. Smoking and Vaping Policy

All Bowls Wellington events are smoke and vape free and not permitted on the Green at any time. It is the responsibility of the host clubs to designate an appropriate area, have clear signage and monitor this throughout the day.

22. Bowls New Zealand BowlsHub ID

Bowls Wellington will be using Bowls Hub for ALL tournament entries for the 2026-27 season and as such all full playing members are asked to sign up to Bowls Hub. For help or more information regarding this, please email info@bowlswellington.com





Dynasty Interclub

Conditions of Play



The following conditions are to be read in conjunction with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations and the Centres General Conditions of Play.

Interclub encompasses three competitions catering for Men, Women and Mixed teams. Clubs are encouraged to enter multiple teams to cater for all levels of player. Only one team per club is permitted for each division, except for the bottom division in the 7s, bottom division of the men's eights and the any combo Wellington Quads.

For the avoidance of doubt, these Conditions are rules of the Centre and any breach of these Conditions will constitute Misconduct under clause 25.1.f.2 of the Centre Constitution.

Dynasty Wellington 7s – Men/Women

The top division, Division 1, will consist of 10 teams. Dependent on entry numbers this will be followed by divisions 2, (& 3 for men), with division 4 & 5 being any combo except that only a team playing in the tournament comprising of all men can be promoted to division 3 if otherwise eligible. There is full promotion & relegation operating between divisions 4 & 5 subject to usual eligibility criteria.

Note that as of this season, a composite team from 2 clubs can be accepted for the lowest women's sevens competition. A composite team will not be able to be promoted.

The make-up of divisions below Division 1 will ideally comprise 10 teams and determined by entries received and a club's previous season's results where possible. The format for 7s is singles, pairs and fours. If the lowest division has insufficient entries to constitute a legitimate competition, the lowest placed teams from the division above (including if they had just been promoted) may come down. Alternately, in the event of high entries, a further division may be added.

Dynasty Wellington 8s - Men

A side in the Wellington 8s consists of a 3-bowl pairs team, a 2-4-2 pairs and a fours team. Division 1 in the men's eights will consist of up to 10 clubs where possible, with qualifying based on the previous season's final placings. If a division 2 competition has insufficient entries to constitute a legitimate competition, the lowest placed teams from division 1 (including if they had just been promoted) may come down.

Dynasty Wellington Any Combo Quad – (Open gender, mixed teams, any combo).

Clubs with insufficient numbers to enter a 7s or 8s team may enter a 4s team in the Wellington Any Combo Quad Division(s). The number of divisions will be determined after entries close. Clubs with insufficient numbers to enter, may join with another club to enter a team. A mixed quad team can be



any combo. The team can include four women or four men players as required to ensure a club can field a team for a given round of play. However, clubs are encouraged to field mixed gender teams where practicable.

Conditions of Play

1. Format

Wellington 7s - each side will play:

1 x Singles	4 bowls 21 shots
1 x Pairs	3 bowls 18 ends
1 x Fours	2 bowls 15 ends

Men's Wellington 8s - each side will play:

1 x Pairs	3 bowls 18 ends
1 x 2-4-2 Pairs	4 bowls 14 ends
1 x Fours	2 bowls 15 ends

Wellington Quads 4s – each side will play:

1 x Pairs	3 bowls 18 ends
1 x 2-4-2 Pairs	4 bowls 14 ends

2. **Venues and draws** will be advised to clubs prior to tournament commencement and will be available on the Bowls Wellington website.
3. **Entry fee.** Entry fees are payable by clubs. An entry fee of \$150 (+ GST) per side will be charged for teams entering the sevens and eights competitions and \$80 (+ GST) per side is the entry fee for the quad teams. Teams that withdraw after the closing date are not eligible for a refund.
4. **Time**
 - a) All games, including finals, are to be completed within 2 hours 45 minutes of the commencement time.
 - b) All morning games are to commence by 9am and afternoon games by 1.30pm unless advised otherwise.
 - c) Rinks for a match are allocated by the home club with the rinks for each discipline being drawn by the visiting team.
 - d) With double headers, the second game, if not started by 1.30pm, may be delayed with the approval of the Bowls Wellington Interclub Coordinator. If unreachable, both sides must explicitly inform the Centre via email of their agreement to delay the game by emailing info@bowlswellington.com.
 - e) If a team, for whatever reason (including traffic) cannot arrive at the venue on time, they must contact the opposing Interclub Coordinator (not the club) and have their express permission to delay the start, otherwise the match will be treated as a default. For this reason, teams are encouraged to ensure they depart for the playing venue as soon as possible.



5. Game Stoppages

If a game is stopped because of darkness, weather conditions or any other valid reason, the game shall be continued either on the same day or on a different day and be completed within the original 2-hour 45-minute time limit. Scorecards must have the start and finish times recorded. The scores will be as they were when the game was stopped. Points will only be awarded where the full game has been completed.

6. Match Definition and Points

A match is a competition between two sides, played over 3 disciplines. (2 disciplines for Wellington Quads)

The match points in each match will be the total of the game points awarded to each side over three disciplines:

Game Win	7 points
Game Draw	4 points
Game Loss	0 points
Bonus Point	1 point

A bonus point will be awarded for either winning by a differential of 11 or more shots or for losing by a differential of 2 or less shots in any discipline.

7. Round Robin Division Placings

Placings in all divisions will be decided by the sides with the best overall **match points** from all rounds played.

At the end of the round robin stage, should two or more sides be equal on **match points**, the side with the most **game wins** will determine the winner (or higher placed team). If still equal, the side with most **game wins and draws** will be the winner. If still equal, the side with the **best overall differential** will be the winner. Finally, if still equal, it will be determined by the **winner** of the match when the 2 sides last met.

8. Finals – Division 1 Only

The Division 1 winner will be decided by a top four playoff, played where possible on the green of the winner of the round robin, referred to as the Minor Premier.

Play Format

The playoffs will be played on a scattered draw format.

Match Points for Finals

The scoring is as set out in paragraph number 6 above. If the overall match points are tied, meaning one game has been drawn, the match drawn will play an extra end.



Teams cannot be re-selected after round 1 on the play-off day - *the Centre expects clubs to play within the spirit of the game.*

Otherwise, a substitute, due to illness or other acceptable reason, can only be approved by the Tournament Manager under the usual substitute conditions.

9. Promotion and Relegation

Promotion and relegation will be automatic with the exchange of four eligible sides i.e., 2 up, 2 down within each division, provided that a team that finishes an Interclub season in a promotion position ("Team 2") will be ineligible for promotion if another team from Team 2's club ("Team 1") will be in the division to which Team 2 seeks promotion in the next Interclub season. For the avoidance of doubt, as promotion and relegation between divisions happen simultaneously, if Team 1 finishes the Interclub season in a relegation position, Team 2 is eligible for promotion and an effective "swap" can occur. (Appendix B)

Should a side be ineligible to be promoted (i.e. the club already has a team in the higher division), then the next eligible team from as far down as 50% of the field in the lower division, will be automatically promoted.

If there is only 1, or no eligible team within the 50% margin from the lower division eligible to be promoted the 1, or potentially both teams eligible for relegation from the higher division, will not be relegated.

A club can only have one team in sevens divisions, except for the lowest division for both men and women, excluding the mixed teams divisions. Except that for Men's Division 3 a 2nd team for this season could only be contemplated if entries allow this.

If there are more than one division in the Men's Eights and Wellington Any Combo Quads, promotion and relegation will apply and there can be multiple entries in the lowest Men's Eights division and all Quad divisions.

Combined club teams in the Wellington Quad divisions are not eligible for promotion.

10. Player Movement

10.1 Subject to clauses 10.2 - 10.4, players may play in different divisions for a club from time to time during an interclub season.

10.2 Notwithstanding clause 10.1, [if during the last 1/3rd of an interclub season] a club wishes to select 2 or more players to play for that club in an interclub round and those players have played no less than 5 interclub games for that club in a higher division that season, the club must obtain the prior written approval of the General Manager of the Centre (or his or her nominee) ("**Movement Request**").

10.3 In seeking such approval, the club will provide the General Manager of the Centre with the following information no later than 5pm on the Wednesday before the relevant interclub round:

- (a) details of the players the club proposes to select for the lower division;
 - (b) the reason(s) for making the Movement Request; and
 - (c) any other information the General Manager of the Centre reasonably requests,
- and the General Manager of the Centre may approve or refuse the Movement Request at his or her sole discretion.



10.4 In deciding whether to approve the Movement Request, the General Manager of the Centre may consider all or some of the following matters:

- (a) the club's reasons for making the Movement Request;
- (b) the club's likely ability to participate in the relevant interclub round if the Movement Request is refused;
- (c) the club's performance and position in each relevant division as at the date of the Movement Request;
- (d) the likely effect of the Movement Request on the integrity of the game of bowls;
- and
- (e) any other matters the General Manager of the Centre considers appropriate.

11. Team Lists and Recording Results

For Bowls Wellington and media requirements, all Division 1 clubs must submit their team lists to bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com by 12pm the Thursday prior to each interclub round.

Club co-ordinators are responsible for recording and submitting results on the official Results Forms. The results must be emailed to bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com by 9am Monday following the Interclub round.

For Division 1 results, club co-ordinators should send these results through by text to the General Manager as soon as possible after play has finished on the day. These results will be loaded as soon as practicable and are for use in afternoon radio broadcasting purposes. The results should still be included with the other club divisions results sent to bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com.

Club co-ordinators are to retain scorecards for each round until final placings are confirmed by Bowls Wellington at the end of the Interclub season.

12. Markers/Scorecards

Host clubs are responsible for providing markers and for the provision of scorecards. If a host club cannot supply markers, they should ask the co-ordinator from the visiting club to assist.

13. Cancellation and Transfer of Greens

Due to microclimates, Bowls Wellington will not postpone Interclub due to weather except under exceptional circumstances. Clubs (via their green staff) retain responsibility for their own green closures and the safety of players. **Club co-ordinators should contact the opposition's Interclub co-ordinator the day prior to discuss contingencies where there is early indication of green closures.** This will assure a smooth and clear process for clubs, players and coordinators the following morning.

Should a Club co-ordinator be away, an interim co-ordinator must be appointed by the Club for that period, and full co-ordinator duties carried out.

Due to the tight nature of the schedule and potential for disruption later in the season, clubs are encouraged to show good faith and make every attempt to play the round on the scheduled



day. Bowls is (mainly) an outdoors sport and inclement weather can be an unavoidable part of the game. Rain does not necessarily constitute play being abandoned, however, if the green or conditions are such to present a health and safety risk, clubs are asked to consider the player's wellbeing.

Where host greens are declared closed, the following actions are to be taken by respective club co-ordinators or team managers:

- a) In the first instance, the opposing club is to be given the opportunity to play the match at their green. If this is not possible, an alternative venue may be arranged by the clubs concerned (the original host club has first choice).
- b) To assist co-ordinators in arranging alternative venues, sides must stay at the original venue until a replacement venue has been found. Should a team depart before the contingency be confirmed, this could be construed as a default loss.
- c) A time limit of 2 hours 45 minutes will apply from the start of play.
- d) If greens are unplayable due to weather and the above options are not available, the host club is responsible for cancellation of play.

14. Defaults

If only a partial discipline in a team plays their match, the completed games shall count as normal. The defaulting discipline shall be deducted 7 points for each game not played with the non-defaulting team awarded 7 points. The deduction will apply unless there are extenuating circumstances approved by Bowls Wellington.

15. Withdrawal of Sides

No refund will be issued after the draw is published.

16. Footwear and Clothing

Refer to General Conditions of Play Section 11.

17. Synthetic Surfaces

All Wellington clubs are eligible to play their drawn home Interclub games on their club green(s). Synthetic surfaces are permitted. All clubs are expected to have greens that meet minimum standards.

18. Neutral venues may be used

Where a club does not have enough rinks on a given Saturday to be able to play all scheduled home games on their own green, the fixture may be played at a neutral venue which will be regarded as the home game for the club concerned for that fixture. This helps assure an appropriate balance of home and away games for each team in the competition.

19. Weekly Results



Weekly results will be uploaded on the Bowls Wellington website by Wednesday provided the club co-ordinators send their returns in by mid-day on the Monday following the Saturday's interclub round. Match results should be sent to: bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com.





Bowls Wellington Men's Pennants

To be read in conjunction with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations and the Centres General Conditions of Play.

Played on Wednesday afternoons during the season. Dates are listed in the 2025 - 2026 program. Draws and results can be found on the Bowls Wellington website under the Ryman Healthcare Pennants tab.

Entry fee.

Entry fees are payable by clubs. An entry fee of \$150 (+ GST) per side will be charged for 8 person teams entering the competitions and \$80(+ GST) per side will be charged for the fours competitions. Teams that withdraw after the closing date are not eligible for a refund.

Conditions of Play

1. Read in conjunction with "Tournament General Conditions of Play"
2. The competition shall be played in two Zones: Wellington and Hutt Valley. The composition of divisions for both zones will be available on the Bowls Wellington website with Round 1 commencing Wednesday 21 October 2026.
3. Clubs may enter a team in each division, or more than 1 team in divisions 3 & 4, but the Centre reserves the right to deny entry or change divisions to avoid a bye situation. Teams in Division 1, 2 & 3 comprise of two Fours, named team A and team B. Division 4 comprises one Four.
4. Matches are to be played on the scheduled dates although circumstances can dictate play by arrangement under exceptional circumstances. Clubs must have approval from Bowls Wellington in such circumstances. Matches start at 1.00 pm. Where home and away format is used the order of play against the same club should change as follows:

1 st Round	A team v A team	B team v B team
2 nd Round	A team v B team	B team v A team
5. Games shall be of 18 completed ends, or a 2 hour 45 minute time limit. The exception being in the inter zone finals when there is no time limit.
6. Points will be allocated on the basis of 2 for a win, 1 for a tie. In addition, 2 points will be awarded to the side with the higher aggregate of shots (tie: 1 point each).
7. Any defaults will result in the non-defaulting side receiving the game points plus the aggregate points. If only one 4's team defaults, then the opponents receive that game's points plus aggregate points and the other 4's team plays and that game's point's count. If an entire side defaults, the side will incur a penalty of (-6). Clubs should make all attempts to field teams and avoid defaulting. Contact should first be made with Bowls Wellington to discuss options.



8. Promotion and Relegation will be automatic between the bottom team of one division and the top eligible team of the next division (Division 1, 2 & 3). Only one team per club is eligible to play in a division, other than Division 4.

Should a side that won their division be ineligible to be promoted (i.e. the club already has a team in the higher Division), then the next eligible team from as far down 50% of the field in the lower division, will be automatically promoted. If there is no eligible team for promotion, the team eligible for relegation will retain their place and not be relegated.

9. Any matches that are postponed shall be played as directed by Bowls Wellington on the scheduled postponement date(s) or other date as directed. In the event of multiple postponements, clubs are to play these in the order set out by Bowls Wellington. Any games not able to be finished on the day due to inclement weather will be completed on another day and shall be recommenced from the point it stopped previously. Scorecards must be retained and used when play re-commences. The completion time limit of 2 hours 45 minutes remains for the full 18 ends.

10. Club coordinators must send results on official score sheets by email to Bowls Wellington at bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com by Thursday 2pm of that same week.

11. All teams within a division of 6 will play each other on a home away basis over the 10 scheduled weeks. In the event of a division having a different number of teams, resulting in a full home and away series not being possible, either a shorter round robin competition or additional games will be scheduled up to a maximum of 10 rounds. In such an instance, clubs in the division will be contacted to confirm prior to the competition starting.

12. **Differentiation of tied teams**

Should teams be on equal competition points at the end of the season the following will apply:
Where a full 'home and away' round robin is completed, teams will be differentiated by:

- (1) The team with the highest '*total shots for*'
- (2) The team with the greatest shots differential (shots for – shots against).
- (3) The greater '*total shots for*' from the games between those teams

13. The winners of each division in the Wellington zone will play-off against the winners of each division in the Hutt Valley zone to decide an overall pennants division champion. A pennant will be awarded to each overall pennants division champion. Players in these teams must be selected in the spirit of the competition. Replacement players may come up from lower divisions. Playoff teams are to comprise of pennant players in their regular division and they must have played at least 50% of round robin matches.

For the finals, if games are drawn and if points are equal, an extra end will be played by the "A" teams.

The finals will be played alternately in the Wellington or Hutt Valley zones. For the 2025 - 2026 season the finals will be played in the Hutt Valley zone.

14. **Cancellation and Transfer of Greens**



Due to microclimates, Bowls Wellington will not postpone pennants games due to weather except under exceptional circumstances. Clubs (via their green staff) retain responsibility for their green closures and **club coordinators should contact the opposition club coordinator the day prior to discuss contingencies where a green closure is possible.** This will assure a smooth and clear process for clubs, players and coordinators the following morning.

With pressure on the season programme, postponed matches may need to be played at a time/date as agreed by the clubs involved, ratified by Bowls Wellington. Options include playing at the opposition teams club or play a catch up round in the morning of another scheduled pennants date.

Where there is a green closure in rounds 1 to 5, the match shall be played at the opposing club if able. This means the game scheduled in rounds 6 to 10 automatically is scheduled at the club who had drawn the home game in round 1, denied by green closure.

Should there be a green closure in rounds 6 to 10, and there is no postponement day available, the game should be played at the opposing team's club, even though this means 2 home games for the opposing club.

15. **Should a club coordinator be away an interim coordinator must be appointed by the club for that period, and full coordinator duties carried out.**





Bowls Wellington Women's Pennants

To be read in conjunction with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations and the Centres General Conditions of Play.

Played on Thursday mornings and afternoons on scheduled dates during the season. The competition commences Thursday 29 October 2026. Dates for rounds are listed in the 2026 - 2027 program online. Draws and results can be found on the Bowls Wellington website.

Entry fee.

Entry fees are payable by clubs. An entry fee of \$80 (+ GST) per team will be charged. Teams that withdraw after the draw is published are not eligible for a refund.

Conditions of Play

1. Read in conjunction with 'Tournament General Conditions of Play'.
2. Divisions comprise of 10 club teams with a full round robin tournament played over 9 rounds. The exception may be in the lower divisions where there may be a different number of teams entered. Only one club team is permitted in each division except for the lowest division.

Should a division have less than 10 teams, the competition may involve a shorter round robin competition or additional games be added up to as many as 10 playing rounds. Clubs will be contacted to confirm the position prior to the competition starting.

3. Each team comprises four players. Clubs may change the personnel of teams between morning and afternoon games.

The interchange of players between divisions is permitted but must be within the spirit of the competition. Players who have been regular members of a team from a higher division should not be used to strengthen lower division teams unless there are no other options and approval sought from Bowls Wellington.

If a club has two or more teams in the lowest division there should be no interchange of players between the two teams unless under exceptional circumstances and approved by Bowls Wellington.

Note, should 2 clubs be unable to enter their own team, there can be a combined club entry.

4. Two games are played each day with morning tea at 9.30am and the first game starting by 10am. There will be no afternoon tea but the players may stop for lunch after the first match. Each player to pay \$1.00 to the host club for catering.

Each team is to complete a scorecard and retain. Results to be emailed to Bowls Wellington bowlswellingtoninterclub@gmail.com by 2pm the following day (Friday).

5. The winner of each division will be the team with the highest game points. If equal, the winner will be the team who won when the two teams met. If that was a draw, the winner will be the team with the highest points differential over all the rounds. If still equal, the winner will be the team with the lowest shots against.
6. Promotion/relegation will be automatic between the bottom team of one division and the top eligible team of the next division. There can be only one team in a division from each club, except for the lowest division. Should a side that won their division be ineligible to be promoted (i.e. the club already has a team in the higher Division), then the next eligible team from as far down 50% of the field in the lower division, will be automatically promoted. If there is no eligible team for promotion, the team eligible for relegation will retain their place and not be relegated.
7. A defaulting team will be deducted 7 points for each game not played. The non-defaulting team will be awarded 7 points for the game.
8. Late arrivals due to unavoidable circumstances will not be classed as a default. Clubs are to call the host club and the opposition pennants' coordinator as soon as possible to inform them of their delayed situation.

Teams, by mutual arrangement, may agree to a later start time or shorten the game.

9. The draw for the season will be sent to clubs once it has been finalised and will be placed on the Bowls Wellington website.

10. Cancellations

Due to microclimates, Bowls Wellington will not postpone pennants due to weather except under exceptional circumstances. Clubs (via their green staff) retain responsibility for their green closures with Bowls Wellington informed. **Club coordinators should contact the opposition club coordinator the day prior to discuss contingencies should there be early prospects of green closures.** This will assure a smooth and clear process for clubs, players and coordinators the following morning.



With pressure on the season programme, postponed matches may need to be played at a time/date as agreed by the clubs involved, ratified by Bowls Wellington.

Should a club coordinator be away an interim coordinator must be appointed by the club for that period, and full coordinator duties carried out.

If possible, cancellations will be posted on the Bowls Wellington Facebook Page and Website.





Bowls3Five Twilight Interclub

Conditions of Play

Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and applicable Bowls New Zealand Domestic Regulations apply.

These Conditions of Play are also made in accordance with Law 55.3 of the Laws of the Sport.

Entry fee for both the Twilight competition is \$80 (+ GST) a team.

1. Competition Format

Twilight Bowls 3Five

The Centre will determine the structure and format of the Twilight tournament once entries have been received. Providing entries are sufficient enough to warrant a viable competition, three Zones (Hutt Valley, Wellington Central and Wellington Northern Suburbs) will be established. Format of play-offs between zones will be determined by entry numbers.

Pending entries and whenever possible, there will be a Junior 1-5 year and Open competition. Social/Casual members are eligible to play in both competitions. Clubs may enter as many teams as they wish. A team with social/casual players must also have at least one full club member in the team to assure knowledge of the rules and etiquette.

All games are played on Monday nights as per the Bowls Wellington program commencing Monday 1 February 2027. Grand finals are scheduled for Monday 5 April 2027, subject to change dependent on format for the tournament.

Interzone Twilight Challenge

This was introduced into the program in 2025. Each Zone (Hutt Valley, Wellington Central and Wellington Northern) will select 2 teams from each of the Open and Junior level competitions to play-off against their Interzone opposition on Monday 19 April 2027 at Naenae indoors. Conditions around team selection and play will be formatted prior to the 19 April 2027 date. The trophy for the Interzone challenge is the Fulcher Cup.

3. Match Format

A match shall consist of a single game (as per Section 6 below).

4. Side Composition

Each side shall be made up of one triple. In the Twilight open grade, and Junior grade there can be "any combo" teams. Open sides may include junior players; however junior sides may not include non-junior bowlers aside from the casual players.



Playing positions between the three players may not be altered at any time during the game.

5. Qualification of Players:

A team member may only play for one club during the Twilight Bowls3Five season.

In the Twilight competition, players may move between teams if required to assist clubs in managing player availability.

Clubs are expected to play within the spirit of the game with regard to moving players between teams.

6. Format of Play

The format of the game will be two bowl triples and each game will be played over two sets, with each set consisting of five ends.

The winner of the match will be the side who has recorded the most set wins. The winner of a set will be the team with the highest number of shots when the fifth end is completed.

If the shot scores are tied after the fifth end of a set, the set will be a draw.

7. Tie-breaker

If a match is tied after the two sets have been completed (each team having won one set or both sets having been drawn), a **one end** tie-breaker is to be played to decide the winner and the winner of the tie-breaker will be awarded the game.

8. First to Play

First set: Teams will toss a coin and the winner determines order of play.

Second set: The winner of the first set shall place the mat and then deliver the first bowl. If the first set is a draw, the winner of the last scoring end in that set shall place the mat and then deliver the first bowl.

Tie-breaker: The opposing skips should toss a coin and the winner of the toss has the options as described above.

In all ends after the first end of each set, the winner of the previous scoring end shall place the mat and then deliver the first bowl.



9. Re-spotting the Jack

If a jack in motion passes completely outside the boundaries of the rink of play (left, right or over the face of the bank), comes to rest in any hollow in the face of the bank, or rebounds to a distance of less than 18 meters from the mat line, the end shall **not** be declared dead, and the jack should instead be placed with the nearest point of the jack to the mat-line at 2 meters, at a spot on the rink which is 2 meters from the front ditch and on the center line. If the spot is partly or completely covered by a bowl, the jack should be placed as close as possible to the covered spot, in line with and between that spot and the corresponding spot at the opposite end of the rink, without touching a bowl.

10. Scoring

Three match points will be awarded for each game won. No match points are awarded for any game lost.

One set point will be awarded for each set won. A half-set point (0.5) will be awarded for each set drawn. No set points are awarded for any set lost (the tie- breaker is not a set).

Ladder position will be determined as follows:

1. Highest number of match points.
2. The team with the highest net total of set points (total set points for – total set points against)
3. If match points and net set points are all equal, the winner of the match between the sides when they last met, will determine the higher ranked team, unless there is a double round of play, in which case the overall result from the double round between the 2 teams will be taken into account.

11. Forfeit

If a team is unable to complete any game, their opponents shall win on forfeit. Points shall be awarded three points for the win and two set points.

The forfeiting side will be penalised with -3 match points and -2 set points.

12. Powerplay

A Power Play enables a team to earn double the shots scored (by that team) in any nominated end. Teams will be allowed one Power Play end per game (not per set) and must be nominated by the team to the opposing team prior to the end commencing. Both teams can nominate to use the Power Play in the same end of a set. If a Team does not nominate to use its one Power Play end in a game, then that Power Play is lost.

There are no Power Plays available for use in a tie-break (section 7).



13. Placing the mat and jack

The jack shall be placed on the centre line on the four-metre mark. The mat may be placed anywhere from the two-metre mark to a point 23 metres from the jack. The rinks shall be marked to provide guidance for the placing of the mat.

14. Substitutions

There shall be no player substitutions once a game has commenced.

15. Movement of Players during Play

Players will be able to follow their bowls up to the head under the following circumstances:

Lead: after delivery of their second bowl. Second: after delivery of their second bowl.

Skips: after delivery of their first bowl.

16. Practice

Trial ends: There will be trial ends before the commencement of any game.

17. Equipment

Marking touchers: Chalk or spray chalk will be used to mark touchers.

18. Decision Making

Measuring: The players in all games will act as the measurer for deciding the number of shots. If an umpire has been appointed to the game, then the umpire will be called by the players, or a player from another rink, if agreement cannot be reached as to the number of shots awarded.

19. Uniforms

Wearing club colours is not compulsory.

20. Media and Communications

Bowls Wellington reserve the right to use any video and photographs taken during this event for further promotional requirements.

21. General

Bowls Wellington reserve the right to alter the format, times of play and allocated rinks and greens to suit local unforeseen circumstances, giving as much notice as practical.

Where a programme is interrupted or cannot be completed due to inclement weather or local conditions, Bowls Wellington may amend the format and length of games at its sole discretion in order to achieve a result or postpone the event where an outcome cannot be achieved. Such a decision by Bowls Wellington may not be appealed.



Bowls Wellington Champion of Champions

Conditions of Play

To be read in conjunction with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition) and Bowls Domestic Regulations and the Centres General Conditions of Play. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to amend conditions of play due to light, inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Please note: A club member who has dual membership may only play in **one** club's championship discipline during a season, including but not limited to regular or substitute players. If a club member is found to have ignored this condition, then that player (and team) will be disqualified from the Bowls Wellington Champion of Champions event as no substitute player will be permitted.

The winner of each club competition can be decided on by the club at time of entries. Club's can play their Championship events as they wish.

1. Eligibility

Where a club has only one entry, dispensation may be granted by Bowls Wellington for that entrant to be eligible to enter the Champion of Champion event. Please contact Bowls Wellington for approval.

The team members of the team that wins a Club Championship are the players who shall be nominated by the club for entry to the Champion of Champions event. Any change in personnel shall be subject to the prior approval of Bowls Wellington, see Part 4 below on "Substitute".

2. Entries

The entry fee of \$30 (+ GST) per player in each discipline is to be paid, except there will be no charge for the Junior 1-5 years singles. Part of the entry fees will be applied to help support Champion of Champions winners towards costs associated with the Bowls New Zealand pathways competition.

Each club championship winner (Junior Singles, Singles, Pairs, Mixed Pairs, Triples and Fours) is eligible to enter the Wellington Champion of Champion series. These knockout tournaments are played over 4 or 5 rounds with minimum of 3 games on Day 1. Finals being played on the Bowls Wellington Champion of Champion Finals Weekend scheduled for 22 & 23 May 2027 at Naenae. Dependent on numbers, it may be possible to play a semi final, especially in the singles events, on Day 1. Singles, Pairs, Mixed Pairs, Triples and Fours are all Centre Title and Gold Star events. Selected games may be live streamed during the finals weekend. The Junior singles



winner does not receive a Centre title qualifying towards a gold star, nor is there Bowls New Zealand pathway event.

Clubs are responsible for entering their teams on the official entry forms as provided by Bowls Wellington with the full names of all players and, if appropriate, a request for a substitute player and the reason behind this.

3. Number of ends for Champion of Champions matches

Singles, 4 bowls 21 up.

Pairs (3 bowls) 18 ends.

Pairs (2-4-2) 14 ends

Triples (2 bowls) 18 ends

Fours (2 bowls) 15 ends.

There is a time limit of 2 hours 15 minutes for all disciplines, with there being no time limit for the Final.

4. Substitute

Any change in playing personnel shall be subject to the prior approval of Bowls Wellington and limited as per Regulation 2 (Law 32.9) of the Laws of the Sport (Crystal Mark Fourth Edition). As per Regulation 2.5(a), any changes to personnel must be considered as equal or lesser ability in the eyes of the Controlling Body. A substitute is defined in Bowls NZ Domestic Regulation 2 and summarised as: A substitute is a player who is temporarily filling in for a player who is expected to return to the team prior to the event finishing. They may not play as skip. (2.4(a) domestic regs). A fours team is limited to 2 substitute player changes and a pairs/triples team one player change. A singles player cannot be substituted.

5. 1-5 Year Singles

Eligible players are those who have been active full playing members of a club for a period not exceeding five years, including the current season. The five seasons do not have to be consecutive. An active full playing member is one who would be eligible to play in club events, whether they have chosen to or not.





Bamberry & Lynch Trophies

2025 - 2026 Winners: Women – Wellington Men – Hutt

The **Bamberry Trophy** was presented to the Centre by the late Doug Bamberry (*Hutt Bowling Club*). The **Janet Lynch Memorial Trophy** is in memory of the late Janet Lynch (Lower Hutt Women's). These are for annual competition between selected sides from Wellington and Hutt Zones of the respective Pennants competitions.

Teams are selected from nominations put forward by clubs. Each side shall comprise eight (8) fours teams. The teams are selected from bowlers participating in the Ryman Healthcare Pennants competition. To be eligible they must have played in a minimum of 50% of the pennants rounds scheduled for that current season.

Clubs must put forward their nominations by the date to be advised.

Conditions

1. Two games of 18 ends shall be played, the morning game starting at 9.30 am.
2. There is no time limit, draws count.
3. Complete scorecards will be kept. Points awarded as follows:
Win = 2 points, Draw = 1 point, loss = 0 points
On completion of two rounds the winning side will be the side with most points.
4. In the event of points being tied, the side with the highest shot differential is to determine the winner.
5. Games will be played alternately at City and Hutt Valley venues.
6. For the 2025 – 2026 season games will be played at Hutt Valley venues.

The Centre will award a *Bamberry Pin or Lynch Button* to each bowler participating in the tournament for the first time.

Diamond Buckles (men) and Diamond Buttons (women)

The event originated circa 1909 when R A Edwin Esq (also associated with Edwin Feathers) presented to the Wellington City Bowling Club two silver buckles inscribed **Wellington Challenge Pairs** and also **Leader** and **Skip**. The original rules were devised by Mr Edwin and amended through the years.

Note entries are sought from clubs, at no cost, to then be drawn randomly to challenge the current holder of the Diamond Buckles/Buttons.

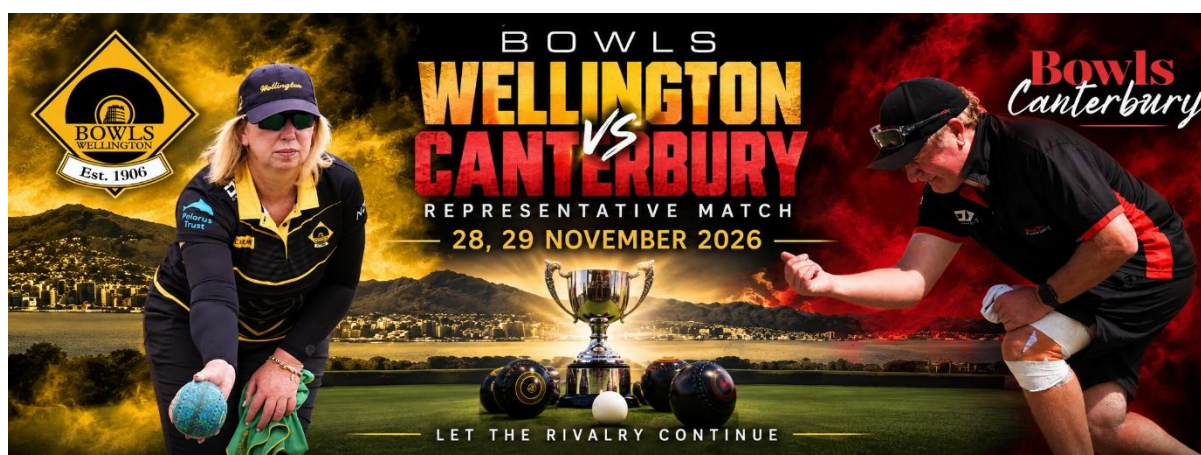

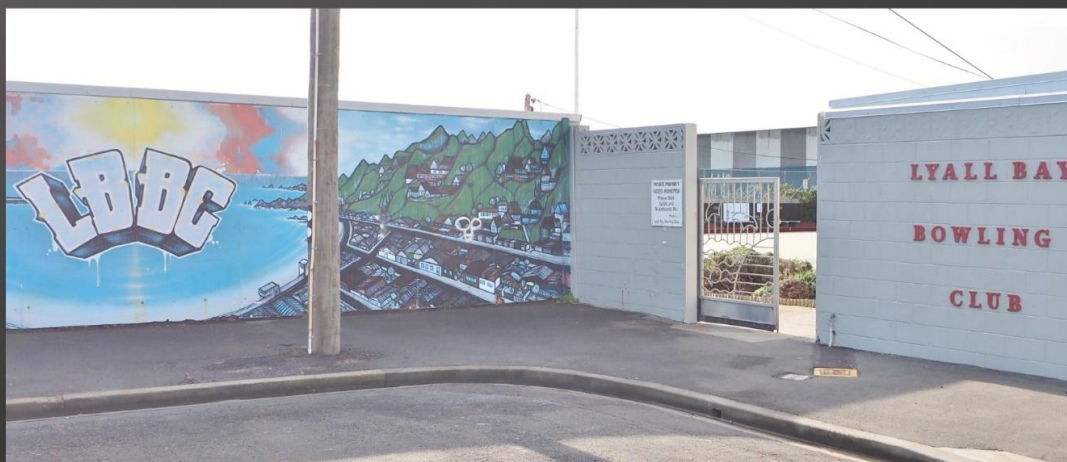
