The meeting commenced at 7.50 p.m.

1. Welcome and Apologies

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Apologies were received from John Carter (Life Member), Don McMurray (Life Member), John Harvey (Life Member), Wendy Mackie (Women's Selector), Glen Coshin (Whitby).

2. Obituaries

The obituaries had been noted in the Delegates' meeting preceding the Annual General Meeting, and a minute's silence observed for Terry Lynch (Naenae), Graham Musgrave (Hutt), Dorothy Pickston (Plimmerton), Sheryl Levy (Plimmerton), Judith Forster (Massey Avenue), Dennis Marshall (Wilton), Mary Logan (Wainuiomata), Anne Zouch (Johnsonville).

3. Confirmation of Minutes of 2020-21 Annual General Meeting

It was resolved an amendment to the minutes from 2020-21 to include Don McMurray (Life Member) in the apologies as he was not added in minutes.

Naenae / Johnsonville Action: General Manager

There were no matters arising.

4. Presentation of Annual Report (2021-2022)

There was a slight adjustment to be made with regard to the National Pairs Title won by Seamus Curtin which will be amended.

Annual Report was taken as read and no comment made by those attending.:

5. Presentation of Annual Financial Report 2020-2021

The General Manager said that Shayne O'Hagan of Small Business Accounting had reviewed the Annual Financial Statements.

It was noted that Bowls Wellington had another surplus for the year and this was even after missing a round of funding due to the vacant General Managers position.

A question was asked from the floor in regards to the sustainability of funding from grants. The chair said that as we have seen an increase in funding from grant over the last 3 years that this was likely for the short term but unsure of any longer-term consequences.

The floor once again asked if Bowls Wellington had been seeking any private entity for a major financial partnership to help sure up finances moving forward. The General Manager explained that part of his position was to look into this and would be seeking out new partnerships in the future. It was asked if anyone on the floor knew of potential possibilities to please be forthcoming to Bowls Wellington with the information.

The floor asked if there was a financial strategy moving forward forecasting future expenses and incomes. The Chair explained we had potentially 2 new board members with sound financial experience who would help the General Manager with this moving forward. The Chair explained that the Board worked formulating and adopting a new Strategic plan and the financial work was the next area that the board will be undertaking with the new General Manger.

It was asked of the impact the new Incorporated societies changes would bring to Bowls Wellington. We would be getting guidance from Bowls New Zealand on this matter. There is a 2-year warming period with the changes, so plenty of time to form a plan.

It was resolved that the Annual Report and Financial Statements for 2021-22 be accepted.

Naenae / Stokes Valley

6. Election of President and Vice-President

Miramar had nominated Dayle Jackson as President of Bowls Wellington. No other nominations had been received. Therefore, Dayle was re-elected unopposed.

Johnsonville had nominated Phil Todd as Vice-President of Bowls Wellington. No other nominations had been received. Therefore, Phil was elected unopposed.

7. Appointment of Board Members

On the recommendation of the Selection Panel, **it was resolved** that Jason Puddick (Stokes Valley) and Rod Leitch be reappointed and retain their position on the board. This was unopposed.

Gerry MacGregor (Life Member) was stepping down from the board and was thanked for his service to the board and Bowls Wellington.

Wilton had nominated Barry Jordan to the Board of Bowls Wellington. No other nominations had been received. Therefore, Barry was appointed unopposed and will replace Gerry MacGregor (Life Member)

8. Bowls Wellington Affiliation Fee

The Board recommended that the capitation fee be increased by 4.9% for the coming 2022-23 season, in keeping with the increase approved by Bowls New Zealand. This is based on membership fees as at 31 December 2018, and as per the affiliation model.

It was noted that CPI at 31 March 2022 was 6.9%

The floor discussed over why Bowls Wellington had taken on the Bowls New Zealand model and not use the old system of current memberships which seemed fairer to the club that had lost memberships since 2018. The Chair explained that current system was in place to encourage clubs to put programs in place to help grow membership in their clubs. Karori noted how the system works best for them as they have increased numbers over the time frame. The Chair explained that the framework for affiliation fees was voted in favour of by clubs about 3 years ago.

The motion was put to a vote in which it was voted in favour of the change.

9. Appointment of Financial Reviewer

It was resolved that the services of Shayne O'Hagan of Small Business Accounting Mana be retained as Financial Reviewer.

It was asked from the floor if the new change with Incorporated societies act would this affect this reviewer. As there is sufficient lead in time to the new act, we would seek guidance on this.

10. Appointment of Board Selection Panel

It was agreed that the Board appoint the Delegates' representative on the Board Selection Panel.

11. General Business

11.1 Reinstatement of Bowls New Zealand Division 2 Competition

Victoria asked the feeling of the floor about reinstating the National Division 2 Interclub competition for the health of the sport and encouraging smaller clubs to keep players. He broke up the discussion to 3 points

1. Encourages participation in a meaningful competition

- 2. Clubs not quite up to Premier (Division1) level had a national competition they could compete for giving a new breed of bowler a chance to win a national event
- 3. Stop clubs from poaching players and helps smaller clubs retain new members Victoria asked that this be taken to bowls New Zealand and submitted as a remit for the AGM

Jason Puddick (Board Member) spoke about this not necessarily being a Bowls New Zealand issue and more an issue to how Bowls Wellington run interclub in the region, limiting the teams that can play in Division 1 National Interclub.

It was agreed that the General Manager would enquire more about this with Bowls New Zealand and the Bowls Wellington Board while Delegates would discuss this with their club's committee's and this would become an Agenda item for the next delegates meeting on Tuesday 1st November 2022.

What support does Bowls Wellington Offer Clubs

Karori talked about their positive outcomes with membership and community focussed bowls events and how the club has turned itself around from the brink of closing. It was asked was there something bowls Wellington could do to help clubs connect and share information that works for each of them. The General Manager spoke to how he is planning to visit all clubs in his first 3 months and will discuss these ideas with clubs. Jason Puddick (Board Member) also spoke to how during the appointment of the General Manager it was made clear that working with clubs would be a major focus of the position.

President's Report 2022 -2023 Season

Bowls Wellington welcomed Blake Signal as our new Business Manager and many new initiatives appeared during the season.

The Wellington Clubs have been encouraged to be more involved in the Bowls Wellington Program with 22 clubs out of 24 playing Pennants and all 24 clubs involved in Interclub. Club individuals made up over 1000 entries into the Open events, then clubs' teams representing themselves and Wellington at the National Bowls3Five, Champion of Champions and PBA Tournaments.

The Club Executives have completed a Club Health Check for Bowls Wellington and had a visit from Bowls New Zealand discussing club policies. The Club members are the to be thanked for their diligence, enthusiasm, and community involvement to this wonderful game. The club programs are becoming more varied, and all are working towards providing opportunities for players both old and young. The resurgence of Wainuiomata and Karori are a fine example of developing an awareness of our sport in the community.

As bowlers we have had the opportunity to see the World Bowls Champion of Champions Singles Championship at Naenae or on YouTube. The initiative of Bowls Wellington to stream our local events, when possible, New Zealand Championships and the Commonwealth games has meant bringing bowls into your home and enjoying those special moments, such as Nicole Toomey winning her Commonwealth Games Medals, and watching your own club bowlers in action.

The Men's Intercentre team winning the competition this year was a highlight and we congratulate the team members and their coach & management team. The Ladies' team were quarter finalists. During their preparation period both teams, including Juniors and Masters won their lower North Island competitions. Wendy Mackie and Leonie Gough, have done some fantastic work over the past six years as the Ladies Representative Management Group and I thank You for your time and effort. Mike Carrol is a member of the Bowls New Zealand high performance team at worked at the Commonwealth Games as the Men's Manager and will be heading to Australia soon to manage at World Bowls Championships.

The development of the Secondary School Program led by Brady Amer and joined by Hamish Ryan has increased participation in this area. We are starting to see the benefits of this filter through and will it will only be good for the sport in the future. The major Secondary School's tournaments had a very full program followed by a strong representative selection who won their lower North Island Tournament. Five of these players went onto represent Wellington in

the inaugural National U26 Tournament set up by Bowls Wellington. Jordan Keene, Jayden Burns, and James MacMillan played well at the National U21 tournament played in Auckland, with a Bronze for both Jordan and James.

The Umpires this year were able to fill their commitments to all events but there is a need for Clubs to encourage more umpires, even from their nonplaying members so there is no difficulty meeting all the requirements. The introduction of a new process of draws, receiving results and post section outcomes has meant players are able to receive information earlier. The World Bowls Tournament meant that the local umpires were selected to participate as officials. We now have four International Technical Officials, and we congratulate Michael Johnson on being the ITO leader for the World Bowls Champion of Champion Singles, Sue Way at the Commonwealth Games, and Michael, Sue, and David Burrage appointed to the World Bowls later in the Year. Paul Hassall has been recently appointed as an International Umpire also.

Many Wellington players are playing in National Tournaments during the season and this year Lisa White won her first New Zealand title in the Mixed Pairs. Clare Hendra also was successful in the National Pairs, while other players from Wellington made Finals in these events.

24 members from Bowls Wellington Clubs participated in the Bowls New Zealand coaching course which was put on free by Bowls Wellington. The Bowls Wellington Supporters' Club continues to draw players in, and all members are now proud owners of a scarf, T Shirt and Beanie.

Firstly, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Board, Staff, Clubs, and Members of Bowls Wellington for their welcome and acceptance of me in the position of General Manager. It has been an exciting time for me to come back to Wellington and help run the sport I love and have a huge passion for. I have been excited to see the potential within the region for the sport and love seeing how vibrant, friendly, and passionate our community are about bowls and our members.

Numbers participating in our tournaments seems to be increasing each year with two events this season eclipsing figures from 12 years' worth of data. A huge effort was put in by our Competitions Manger, Ross Gillett to make sure our events were well organised and able to run smoothly for our Tournament Managers. With the loss of Gerry MacGregor running our events as Tournament Manager we were fortunate to have a small team of volunteers help this season. A big thanks to Sue Way, Ron Wood, and Steve Crowhurst who have been instrumental in our delivery of events this season. We hope they continue to help, but we are always happy to have more volunteers assist in this area and if you know of anyone, please let us know.

Champion of Champions' weekend has become bigger and better with each passing year and this year we saw a fantastic event which had 9 different clubs taking out the ten titles available on the weekend. A feat I would be surprised has been done before. There was excitement aplenty as there were 6 finals that came down to the last end showing the competitiveness between the clubs in Wellington is alive and well.

Our representative program this year was extremely busy. With catch-up events from last season's Covid-19 affected competitions we saw our representative teams compete in two National Finals. In October we were narrowly placed second in both the Men's and Ladies competitions. In March we finally saw our Men's side win the National Inter-Centre for just the third time. The ladies were knocked out in the quarter-final of their event by eventual winners Nelson. With a host of trophies won over the season by all representative players, we can rest assured that Bowls Wellington is well represented.

Bowls Wellington continues it work with Nuku Ora and the Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa Fund for the position of an Engagement and Inclusivity Officer. This funding was re-approved and we were able to keep Brady Amer employed to run our work with young people that introduces them to the sport of bowls. Brady has increased participation and engagement with our Rangatahi in bowls throughout the Wellington region and is working hard on introducing more players with Physical and Mental disabilities with help from the Halberg foundation and Special Olympic New Zealand. Brady has been so busy with his work in these areas Nuku Ora allowed us to include a casual staff member to help with the youth and inclusivity programs we now run. Hamish Ryan joined our team in February and has been a great inclusion to these programs. With numbers sitting in the thousands for the season we know this growth in participation will have a flow on effect in our sport.

Operationally Bowls Wellington has been running smoothly, and through the work of our finance team on the board we have been able to set up and implement a more accurate budget to work to. We have been able to update and maintain our equipment at the office to help us keep things running smoothly. We have tried to implement some new initiatives to help clubs this season and will continue to work with clubs into the future to help keep our game strong.

Thanks to Clubs, players, umpires, greenkeepers, commercial and funding partners, sponsors, friends, supporters, and our community for the support you have given me over the season. I am excited about our opportunities for growth in our sport for the future and look forward to working for you.


