Greetings from Bowls Kapiti Coast

Bowls Kapiti Coast warmly welcomes the players from Wellington, Wairarapa, and Manawatu for the Junior 1-5 yr WKWM Quadrangular tournament. We look forward to hosting you all in this event and hope you enjoy your experience and make lifelong friendships.

WKWM Tournament

Competing Centres:

Kapiti Coast, Manawatu, Wairarapa and Wellington.
There are separate trophies presented to the men's and women's winners.

Team Numbers: 8 players of 5 years or less playing experience

Playing Disciplines: 1x Singles, 1x Pair, 1x 2x4x2 Pair, 1x Triple.

Venue: Levin Bowling Club

Conditions of Play:

All games to be played in accordance with 'Laws of the Sport of Bowls' Crystal Mark 4th Edition and Bowls NZ Domestic Regulations.

Singles: 21 shots
Pairs (3 bowl): 18 ends
2-4-2 Pairs: 14 ends.
Triples (2 bowl): 18 ends

Time Limit 2 hours

- Jack re-spotted by opposition if improperly delivered, not redelivered.
- A substitute may be used at any time for any reason, during a game, in accordance with the NZ Domestic Regulations and subject to the approval of the Tournament Manager. The substitute must play in any position other than skip.
- Players must not change between disciplines, but the order of play may be altered between Rounds.
- If the jack is "killed" after the bell has sounded, the end will be replayed.
- The Tournament Manager has the sole right to amend the schedule and/or playing conditions as deemed necessary.

Result: Determined by wins (1 points) and draws (.5 point). If equal then on differential over all rounds, if still equal then by most 'shots for' over all rounds.

Restricting the Movement of Players during Play:

Singles the opponents after delivery of their 3rd and 4th bowls
Pairs the Leads after delivery of their 3rd bowls
the Skips after delivery of their 2nd and 3rd bowls
Triples the Leads and Seconds after delivery of their 2nd bowl
the Skips after delivery of each of their bowls
2-4-2 Pairs the first player playing 2 bowls, after the delivery of their 2nd bowl, the player playing 4 bowls, after the delivery of their 3rd and 4th bowl and the player playing the last 2 bowls, after the delivery of each of their bowls.

In exceptional and limited circumstances, a Singles player can ask the Marker for permission to walk up to the head, or a Skip can ask that a player walks up to the head earlier than described above.

Use of Electronic Devices

Pursuant to Law 41.7, players with a hearing disability can use electronic devices to communicate with each other while on the rink of play, or with a marker in a singles game.

Electronic devices should not interrupt or interfere with any other players or disrupt the flow of the game. The electronic device must be non-intrusive to other players or officials that are present on the green at any time during a game. As a guide, the use of the device should be no more intrusive (in terms of volume) than any other conversation between players in any game.

Catering: Afternoon tea provided to Players and Managers. BYO lunch.

Smoking/ Vaping is not permitted on or near the green. Host's club smoking policy to be adhered to.
